A thunderstorm appeared suddenly, and as they hurried to seek shelter, he was amazed at the strength of the storm, the loud thunder, lightning, and the strong winds blowing over the fields of grain. The storm ended shortly and a beautiful rainbow appeared in the blue sky.. When Boberg reached his home, he heard church bells ringing and began writing a poem, titled, "How Great Thou Art". He later arranged the poem to a Swedish folk song. It is amazing how such common occurrences can inspire us to do extraordinary things. They may not be writing a great human, but our inspirations are still meaningful and important.


Favorite Hymns

SEMI-ANNUAL MEETING AGENDA AND MINUTES June 23, 2024 11:15 am meeting

The meeting was called to order at 11:17 am by Sue Clapp, OSLC Council President.

Devotions were given by Pastor Cindy McKenzie. Her message was based on Acts 3.

<u>Secretary's Report from January 21, 2024 annual meeting.</u> The report was included in the meeting packet distributed to the congregation. Al Johnson moved to accept the Secretary's report. Therese Plummer seconded. All in favor. Carried.

<u>Treasurer's report-</u> Dave Sampson reported a correction to the Account Balances Report distributed to the congregation. The Total General Funds amount reported as \$17,507.34 should be \$86,075.49. The Total Designated Funds amount reported as \$174,341.09 should be \$105,772.94. There was a formula error in the report. General Fund giving has not been keeping pace with General Expenses. Council will keep an eye on this and advise when we need to act. Al Johnson moved to accept the Treasurer's Report. Betty Goehring seconded. All in favor. Carried.

<u>Property Board Report</u>- Rick Rogness reporting. Thank you to members of the property board. Some members help with projects. Some members serve as mentors. The new air conditioner has been installed in the office area and is functioning well. Everything is functioning properly around the church building. Wires do need to be replaced in the yard sign so the lights can function.

Old Business:

Comments from Ministry Teams-none

Increase in Parish/Financial Secretary's hours- In February council approved increasing Therese Plummer's pay from 20 hours per week to 25 hours per week. She consistently works more than 20 hours per week. The council was not able to make the increase permanent without the approval of the congregation. The increase in pay exceeds the spending limit imposed by the constitution for expenditures outside of the budget. At this time the congregation is being asked to approve this increase in hours for the remainder of 2024. Ann Larson moved to increase the pay hours from 20 to 25 hours per week for the remainder of 2024. Laurie Strottman seconded it. All in favor. Carried.

<u>Synod Assembly Report</u>- Sue Clapp reporting. On May 17 & 18 Pastor Cindy, Al Johnson and I attended the Synod Assembly in Coralville. It was basically a business meeting for the Synod but there was also worship, food, breakout sessions and music! One of the resolutions that was adopted was for congregations to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the ELCA's commitment to supporting World Hunger Foundation. Here at Our Savior's, we will be designating September as our World Hunger Month and will be accepting donations to be sent to the Synod by the first part of October. More details will be coming later. The theme of the Synod Assembly was "Listen! God is Calling. God is about to do a new thing. Do you not perceive it?" We were encouraged to consider how we answered when God called. I reflected on how our congregation is filled with those who are listening to God's call. Whether you are attending or assisting, singing or playing in the bell choir, donating or serving, cleaning or maintaining the property, quilting or decorating, reading or ushering, and so many other ways; you are serving God's call. And I think today we will be hearing more about the new thing God is about to do for us. Thank you for sending us to this assembly.

New Business:

<u>Audit Report</u>-Nancy Trout reporting. Once again, this year Reena Winkowski audited OSLC. She found everything was in order. We are meeting the expectations set forth in the synod audit guidelines.

<u>Benevity Portal</u>- Rachel Sindelar reporting. The Benevity Portal is an online donation platform. This portal is a partnership with Collins Aerospace. OSLC has been set up on the portal to link with the Leslie Strottman fund. Congregation members who wish to donate can do so through their church offering. Rachel Sindelar will enter the donation to the portal on behalf of OSLC. Since she is an employee of Collins Aerospace the donation will be matched by Collins.

<u>New Constitution</u>- Sue Clapp reporting. There were two main changes to the constitution. The by-laws are now embedded in the constitution rather than being a separate document. The quorum requirement for congregational meetings has been reduced from 45 to 25 attendance. Dave Sampson moved to approve the constitution. Ann Larson seconded. Sue Clapp asked for any questions. Seeing none the vote was called. All in favor. Carried.

<u>Nominations and Council Elections</u>-Lori Hayes reporting. The nominating committee included Tom Zuber, Marv Houg, Ardy Erickson, Suzanne Schmitt, Laurie Strottman and chairperson Lori Hayes. Thank you to those leaving council at the end of their terms; Nicole Flockhart, Suzanne Schmitt and Dorothy Powers. Two members have completed terms in one role but remain on council in another role. Laurie Strottman completed her term as Education/Youth Co-Chair. Sue Clapp completed her term as Evangelism/Public Relations Co-Chair. Nancy Trout will continue with a second term as Co-Secretary. The following have assumed new roles on council. Hannah Plummer will serve as Evangelism/Public Relations Co-Chair. Ann Larson will service has Parish and Staff Co-Chair. Al Johnson will serve as Fellowship Co-Chair. Natalie Fiester will serve as Education/Youth Co-Chair. Jennifer Ayers will serve as Co-Secretary. Sue Clapp called for nominations from the floor. There were no additional nominations. Rob Barth moved the council slate be approved. Laurie Strottman seconded. All in favor. Carried. Council installation will be June 30, 2024.

<u>Call Committee</u>-Al Johnson reporting. We have good news from the call committee. Here is the timeline of events. On March 27 a candidate was recommended by the synod for the call committee to contact. The candidate is a first call placement. There were several email exchanges with the candidate and the synod. Then, on Saturday, May 4, the call committee met with the candidate in a face to face interview. The interview was positive and we as a group came away feeling this would be a good match for our church. The call committee has recommended to the council that a call be issued. The council accepted this recommendation. The executive board has completed the compensation package. This package has been approved by council, synod and candidate. Our candidate is Bernice Jeannine Dilliard. She prefers to use "Bunny". Pastor Bunny is newly graduated from Wartburg Seminary so this is her first call. She does have previous experience as a Director of Youth and Families at a Lutheran Church in Texas and served as an Intern at Grace Lutheran Church in Des Moines. She will be with us for worship next Sunday, June 30th. She will join us for the meal after service. This will be a meet and greet day here at Our Savior's. The call committee has approved this call. The council has approved and the synod has approved. The next step is for the congregation to consider this call and vote. On Sunday July 14, we will have a brief special congregational meeting immediately following the service. We will be voting via paper ballot on whether to call Bernice "Bunny" Dilliard to be our new pastor. At this time, I want to thank the members of the call committee for their commitment to this process. Once we had a candidate, things needed to move rather quickly. I appreciate the committee members making themselves available when needed. Thank you!

Sue Clapp added that Deacon Jodi Schuman will be here for the July 14th vote.

Other new business. None

<u>Hannah Plummer's Youth Report</u>-Therese Plummer shared Hannah's report. The youth have had a very exciting year – from fundraisers like the Chili Cook-off in February to the ever famous Pies for Palms and Easter Breakfast. Our kids took a trip to Bloomsbury farms this past fall as well! Most excitingly we will head to New

Orleans in a few short weeks for the ELCA National Youth Gathering along with youth from Gloria Dei, St. Stevens, and St. Andrew! The following week will be Vacation Bible School led by Camp EWALU staff. In the upcoming year, we are hoping to begin a confirmation class as well as a First Communion class. We also had a very successful year of Sunday School this past year as we continue to use the "Dig In" curriculum from Group Publishing. Kids also made the crosses that are handed out on Ash Wednesday and made Valentines for Veterans that were handed out at the VA Hospital in Iowa City to hospitalized veterans. We are looking forward to the upcoming year ahead as well as continue to grow in God's love together!

<u>Pastor Cindy's Report</u>-Pastor Cindy met Pastor Bunny at Synod Assembly and highly recommends her. Pastor Cindy sees Pastor Bunny as a good match for OSLC. Pastor Cindy went on to talk about all the missions OSLC supports including; Kenwood student needs, quilts, His Hands shoe donations which were picked up on Friday, Willis Dady, noisy offering just to name a few. We are also good about caring for our own. All of this is a testament to the Holy Spirit working in this place.

Al Johnson moved to adjourn the meeting. Natalie Fiester seconded. All in favor. Carried.
