Lent at Our Savior's Lutheran Church

Lent is a season of reflection, repentance, and preparation—a time to journey with Christ toward the cross. For 40 days (excluding Sundays), we are invited to deepen our faith through prayer, fasting, and acts of service. It begins on Ash Wednesday (March 5th) and continues through Holy Saturday, the Saturday after Good Friday, and before Easter (April 20).

Why Do We Set Aside "Alleluia" in Lent?

In Lutheran (ELCA) tradition, we refrain from saying or singing "Alleluia" during Lent as a way of reflecting the season's penitential and reflective nature. Lent is a time to turn back to God, acknowledge our need for grace, and prepare for Easter through reflection and renewal. The absence of "Alleluia" reminds us of Jesus' suffering and sacrifice. It creates a sense of longing that is fulfilled on Easter Sunday. By setting "Alleluia" aside, its return on Easter morning becomes even more joyful, mirroring the resurrection celebration.

As we enter this sacred season, our sanctuary will shift from green to purple, a color symbolizing repentance and the royal nature of Christ. This visual change reminds us of Jesus' journey to the cross and our own call to renewal.

This year, our Wednesday evening Lenten services will take a fresh approach, re-imagined with the worship team under the theme: **All We Need**

What do we need to survive and thrive? We all know about the basics—air, food, water, shelter. But what else?

- Sleep?
- Human connection?
- An abiding sense of purpose?
- Prayer?

What about the people in our congregation? What are we missing? What do we long for? And beyond our church doors—what are the deep needs of our neighbors?

We need a multitude of things. This Lent, we will explore them together. Through worship, reflection, and community, we will ask how God provides for us and how we are called to care for one another.

Join us on Wednesday evenings as we walk this journey together, seeking not just to survive, but to thrive in God's love.
